FINANCE AND MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Our Secretary and Treasurer, Carol Francis and Russell Bradford, work tirelessly behind the scenes, ensuring that we have our house in order, and they have asked for a reminder to be published that fees for the BICC must be paid by the end of March to avoid a late payment fee of £10.
